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Executive Summary

In 2023-24, H2i continued its record of providing outstanding and impactful mentorship, supporting our diverse international health technology client community. This year saw the expansion of our team for H2i-HENT with the addition of a new lead Level 3 Mentor, Fraidianie Sévigné. This marked the beginning of supporting ventures on their scaling of activity. Our diversity and scope of industry mentors grew and contributed to over 150 mentorship hours to H2i's 47 African venture startups. Ventures generated \$20M revenue (1M non-dilutive+10M equity+9M sales) and have been featured across the African continent.

This new growth is the product of the whole H2i community, which is celebrating its 10th anniversary in 2024. As the sole health focused campus-linked accelerator at the University of Toronto, H2i provides support for health startups across the university throughout their venture pathway, without jurisdictional limitations (across the tri-campus; and strategically on behalf of UofT at the provincial, national, international levels). With a growing portfolio of African ventures as part of the Africa Higher Education Health Collaborative and in partnership with the Mastercard Foundation, H2i supported UofT's VP-International mission in its global commitment to ensure equitable access to entrepreneurial resources and activities, in addition to helping build mentors and KOL cohorts, while developing additional EDI-centric activities (e.g. FemSTEM domestic and now FemStem Africa series).

This year was a year of change, which saw new leadership, a partnerships with all 8 collaborating schools on the continent grow substantially to more than 25 activities on the planned agenda for 2024-25, and more efforts in advocacy for venture support, investor readiness, and expansion of national and international partnerships. Our team at H2i hopes that this momentum will carry towards catalyzing the health innovation and commercialization agenda at the University of Toronto, into the next decade.

THE HENT MISSION

To support the fostering of multiple innovation hubs across the African continent, which enable entrepreneurs, focusing on youth and women, to grow their ventures in the medical health space.

VISION

Co-creation of fully independent ventures providing healthcare related solutions that are Afrocentric, scalable and impactful, while increasing employability and sustainability in healthcare.





VALUE PROPOSITION

Health Entrepreneurship (HENT), within the Africa Health Collaborative at the University of Toronto, aims to support emerging health accelerators to empower health entrepreneurs across Africa.

The HENT program aims to provide solutions to some of the challenges in Africa through education, mentorship and funding, with a focus on youth and women.







African Impact Challenge (HENT-AIC)

The Health Entrepreneurship -African Impact Challenge is run by the African Impact Initiative and The BRIDGE, with support from UofT accelerators H2i and ICUBE. It is supported by the Mastercard Foundation and the Africa Health Collaborative broadly.

HENT-AIC's year-long boot-camp training model concludes each summer with a 10-week visit to Toronto. H2i's 2023-24 year began with the privilege of co-hosting 12 remarkable members of the 2022 HENT-AIC Cohort. H2i delivered co-created programming including Hack & Huddles with Ideation Clinic and the Translational Research Program (TRP), an Accelera on Intellectual Property, and a speaker session with the Ontario Bioscience Innovation Organization (OBIO).

In the fall, H2i was thrilled to begin supporting the 10 health ventures in the 2023 HENT-AIC Cohort for a year of programming and summer visit in Summer 2024.









MOI University x H2i

In July 2023, in collaboration with H2i, MOI launched an Entrepreneurial program and Hackathon focused on educating students on Entrepreneurship and engaging them in a Hackathon, where ventures can work and refine their venture ides, while receiving mentorship and onboarding into H2i.

H2i matched funding to run the program from July-December 2023 in two phases. In total, 28 entrepreneurs registered, 24 attended at least 1 of the 10 modules, and 9 were selected to move onto the Hackathon stage which took place in the first quarter of 2024.

H2i provides mentorship services and professional service vouchers (by application) to the ventures who finished the program.

Currently 6 of these ventures have joined H2i and have access to the full scope of H2i's resources and programs.



AIMS x UCT x H2i

In 2023, H2i worked with The African Institute for Mathematical Sciences (AIMS) and University of Cape Town (UCT) to co-create strategies surrounding Health Entrepreneurship programming.

H2i participated as a collaborator in two resulting initiatives:

- AIMS and H2i collaborated in a two-day workshop held in Kigali, Rwanda which
 welcomed 60+ industry experts to discuss how to train trainers in entrepreneurship.
 Training educators in entrepreneurship is crucial for equipping them with the skills and
 knowledge needed to guide students beyond traditional academic paths. AIMS identified
 that, to create an entrepreneurial ecosystem within its institute, it was essential to first
 educate the educators on the fundamentals of entrepreneurship. Further, H2i and AIMS
 have successfully merged data engineering students with ventures to accelerate their
 data need. This is a positive step in showcasing how scholars can get into
 entrepreneurship with their skillset.
- UCT and H2i collaborated in a four-day round of workshop meetings with seven groups.
 Before the workshop, specific information gathering sessions were held. There was an initial workshop day with multiple groups and then the different platforms were engaged through workshops and meetings with specific groups to design a prototype ecosystem that would be used to develop the UCT entrepreneurial space.







ALU x ALX x Sand Tech x H2i

H2i, African Leadership University (ALU), ALX Africa and Sand Technologies are collaborating to provide themed Accelera sessions. The themed Accelera will focus on key topics such as Intellectual Property, Product (Supply Chain), Regulatory, and Marketing. These are key areas which HENT ventures have mentioned require more training and have also been identified as gaps by H2i and its HENT institutional partners.

With Sand Technologies, H2i will co-create programs that facilitate clinical field validation with Sand Technologies' network of clinical franchises, and build mentor networks supporting clinical deployment.

H2i is also providing collaborative mentorship for on-boarded ALU/ALX ventures, in addition to the full scope of resources available to H2i ventures.









AMREF x H2i

In August 2023, in collaboration with H2i, AMREF launched **AMREF Academy** focused on educating students on Entrepreneurship. This is also an environment for existing ventures to incubate in both H2i and AMREF concurrently. There are 20 registrants in the first cohort, 8 of which, to-date, are incubating in H2i.

AMREF held a lecture in November 2023, which delivered entrepreneurial education to founders. H2i contributed to the lecture and provided information about what H2i can offer to ventures.

UofT and H2i provided participation support (presentations) at the pitch event on November 25th, 2023. The top three community companies were recognized and won 3 x \$3000 CAD in Professional Services Vouchers from H2i.





KNUST x H2i

Kwame Nkrumah University of Science and Technology (KNUST) and H2i collaboratively identified two areas for co-creation of new programming to develop entrepreneurial training:



- Train the Entrepreneur will look at identifying ventures and training them with defined skills to run successful ventures. 36 ventures pitched in December 14-16, 2023, and the top 5 ventures were onboarded to H2i. H2i and KNUST reviewed the group in January 2024 and commenced mentorship delivery.
- MSc. Health Entrepreneurship Program. This is an integration of HENT and Health Ecosystem (HECO) activity and is a larger co-creation project with the Department of Laboratory Medicine and Pathobiology (LMP) at UofT. H2i assisted in recruiting experts from the UofT's Faculty of Public Health and UofT accelerators ICUBE, The BRIDGE and H2i, to create educational modules to offer to students who are interested in entrepreneurship within the medical space.





ENTREPRENEURIAL EDUCATION Core Programming







Roundtable discussion groups led by an industry or academic facilitator on topics that are central to the issues and challenges faced by early-stage startups.

Accelera is for entrepreneurs to share their experience, knowledge, and challenges so that they may help each other navigate common problems, succeed, and grow.

Accelera is delivered via 3 concurrent streams, reflecting the needs of our client companies at different stages. All streams introduce tools and competencies for effective entrepreneurship.

INVESTMENT WORKSHOPS

In 2021, H2i set out to better understand what more could be done to help prepare ventures in earlier stages to be ready to obtain investment in later stages. This emerged from the recognition of the **critical need for accessible investment-focused programming** within the Toronto ecosystem.

That year, H2i held a series of four **focus groups** with ventures, Angel investors, VC investors, and investment lawyers, to discuss answers to six fundamental questions, which were directed towards defining new multi-year programming. The results from these sessions, alongside subsequent consultation with ventures and industry experts led to the publishing of H2i's **Investor Program White Paper** in 2023.

In 2023-24, H2i continued to address the needs outlined in the White Paper's findings, through three tailored investment workshops and an additional **five planned workshops** for the coming year. The new year kicked off in May 2024 with a workshop titled **Networking Towards Accessing US Capital**, which welcomed 98 participants to delve into diverse strategies and capabilities needed to navigate the investment landscape focused on the United States.

Created in 2017, H2i's FemSTEM program looks to inspire, engage, and celebrate women entrepreneurs in the health space. H2i's annual **Professional Services Voucher** program provides much needed financial support to H2i community members. Client companies who regularly attend Accelera sessions can apply to receive a voucher worth up to \$3000 CAD to be used toward professional services that further accelerate venture and product growth. To date, we have provided **nearly \$270,000 CAD in non-dilutive funding** support through this program.

In 2023, H2i, in partnership with The Mastercard Foundation, established dedicated a Professional Service Voucher fund for HENT ventures from across Africa.

The **FemSTEM Africa Pitch Competition** was the culminating event of the inaugural FemSTEM Africa event series. The pitch competition, judged by a panel of industry experts, gives up-and-coming healthcare innovators the opportunity to present their idea to the public and the chance to win prizes totaling \$25,000 CAD in cash and \$15,000 CAD in in-kind legal services to scale their project.

The finalists, A-Lite Uganda Ltd, Eudio Mobile, PlyChain, PUMZI Devices Uganda Ltd, Remedius Mobile Health and URUKUNDO Initiative, were selected from a competitive pool of 24 applicants. Pitches were presented to the over 70 guests present and the panel of four esteemed expert judges: Adwoa Birago Nyantakyi, Grace Almendras-Castillo, Leah Nduati and Monica Kahindo.

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


